### Let's Talk

Look closely at all the pictures in this book. Ask why it starts with the word “click” on the front endpaper. Why is the page black?

Talk about shadows-Are the children afraid of shadows? Do they ever see things differently in a shadow?

How is the gutter being used? Where is this girl?

Why do the shadows change?

### Let's Move

Set up a light that shines on children to a blank wall. Let them dance and move to see their shadows in different ways.

Hold up an item behind a curtain to show its shadow, have children guess what it is.

Do a shadow puppet theater. Let children participate.

### Let's Create

Place plastic animals on table top, shine light on them to create a shadow, give children paper and pencils to trace the animals.

Create shadow puppets with cardboard (any shape children want) glue onto stick and let them do a show behind a sheet, shadow puppet theater.
