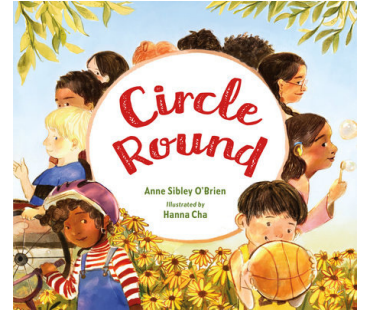




# A Guide to *Circle Round*
