

#### Let's Talk

What do you do when you disagree with someone? Do you argue or try to see it their way?

Have you ever spent time looking at clouds? Did you see animals or anything else in their shapes?

This book uses the gutter (the center crease of the book) to show two sides of the same story in different ways. Take a look and see if you notice where the comments are coming from. How does turning the book change your view?

### Let's Move

Finger play: Five Little Clouds

"Five little clouds up in the sky, drifting, floating way up high...One disappeared from the sky so blue, When a big gust of wind came blowing through." Repeat with: Four little clouds ...Three little clouds ...Two little clouds ...One little cloud ...

Hop like a bunny and waddle like a duck.

Go outside and look up at the clouds! See what shapes they are.

# Let's Create

Gently pull apart a cotton ball using your pincher grasp (thumb and fingers). Let it stay in a single shape and glue it on a blue piece of paper. Now look closely and decide what you see in your "cloud." Turn it around in different directions to see it from other angles. Name your creation.
