IRW Board Member Job Description

The Board of Directors supports the work of IRW and provides mission-based leadership to ensure the organization's health and welfare both now and in the future. Service on the board is for a three-year term that is renewable. Responsibilities of individual Board members include the following:

- Commit time to IRW, including attending all board and committee meetings as required and reading all materials prior to board meetings
- Understand the roles and responsibilities of nonprofit governance, including respecting appropriate governance boundaries
- Participate fully in board meetings and serving on at least one committee
- Volunteer for board assignments
- Be knowledgeable about the mission, vision, and strategic priorities of IRW and making decisions that support the organization; staying informed on trends, challenges, and opportunities that could affect the organization
- Participate fully in board self-assessments and professional development
- Ensure the ongoing financial health of IRW by reviewing and approving the organization's annual budget and quarterly financial reports
- Contribute to the evaluation of the Executive Director, as requested
- Identify and recruit board members; making a commitment to building a diverse board
- Give to IRW financially to the best of the board members ability and make IRW a
 priority of time and talent during board service
- Serve as an ambassador for IRW with all stakeholder groups and with the larger external community
- Keep all board deliberations and actions confidential
- Participate in major organization activities (i.e. Summer Morning in Maine)
- Get to know other board members and IRW personnel and building strong,
 respectful relationships within the organization and the greater community that
 IRW support
